### **GENDER AND CREATIVE ECONOMY: NETWORKING AND LEARNING SUPPORT**

This event is co-hosted by our EU funded project SMARTJUMP based at Confindustria Veneto SIAV, Venice Region Italy with the Goldsmiths Department of Media and Communications, and Centre for Feminist Research. The Goldsmiths team is Angela McRobbie (PI) Sian Prime ICCE, and Dr Dan Strutt.

The idea underpinning the afternoon event is to reflect on how women, across the boundaries of age, sex, class and ethnicity, region and country, find themselves positioned in regard to both current debates on the rise of the creative economy and in the context of the 2008 economic crisis and subsequent period of austerity. The questions we will be asking include how are young women 'subjectivised' by prevailing neoliberal discourses around self-entrepreneurship? How are new modes of competition inscribed within these fields of cultural activity? What does it mean when EU programmes for social equality agendas undergo neoliberalisation by means of 'creative economy', and how does this impact on women, young people and socially disadvantaged groups? How can innovative learning and networking help in an internationalisation process? How effective have resistance movements (e.g. precarity politics) been in challenging the 'myth' of the creative economy? Throughout the afternoon speakers will offer reflections on work in progress.
